This Indenture made and entered into this 25th day of December 1837 between Benjamin Cobb and Margaret his Wife of the one part and Nancy Gardner and her three infants children, namely, Nancy M'Kintosh, Mary Thomas Middleton and son Eastice of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia witnesseth that first and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars in hand paid the said Benjamin Cobb & Margaret his Wife at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents,

They both hereby acknowledge, hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain, sell alien and convey unto the said Nancy Gardner, during her life and to the said Nancy (W. Mary T.M. and Eastice Gardner, infants of the said Nancy Gardner as aforesaid, a full and clear fee simple right and title, in and to a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton, bounded by the lands of James D. Bryant Sam'l Wallace others supposed to contain fifty acres by the same, more or less, with all and singular the appurtenances therunto belonging or in any way appertaining, and if either of the said children should die before arriving to lawful age, his or her proportion shall go to the survivor or survivors, and the said Benjamin Cobb and Margaret his wife, for themselves their heirs executors and administrators, the said tract or parcel of land unto the said Nancy Gardner during her life and unto the said Nancy (W. Mary T.M. and Eastice Gardner, children of the said Nancy Gardner as aforesaid their heirs of each of them forever, shall well and do forever warrant and defend by these presents the said tract of land against the claim of them the said Benjamin Cobb & Margaret his wife, and all and every person or persons claiming by or through them unto the said Nancy Gardner for life and to Nancy (W. Mary T.M. and Eastice Gardner, to them and their heirs forever. In testimony whereof we have hereunto subscribed our names and affixed our seals the day and date first above written.
