This Indenture made and entered into this the 19th day of January 1837 between Lawson Beal of the one part Edward Beaton of the second part and James Jackson of the third parts witnesseth that whereas the said Lawson Beal stands justly indebted unto the said James Jackson in the sum of three hundred and seventy three dollars fourteen pence due by bond or note on the 19th day of June 1837 and being desirous to secure the payment thereof hath for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Edward Beaton bargained and sold, chenued, released, discharged and by these presents doth grant, sell, alien, enfeoff and confer unto the said Edward Beaton his heirs executors administrators and assigns the following property unto a certain tract or parcel of land laying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation one hundred and eighty five acres more or less bounded as follows, to wit West by Middleton, North by Weston, East by Bryants Road, South by J. Williams also one bay mare, one ox, two hens, blackbirds and furniture all my house hold & kitchen goods to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land & premises together with the aforesaid personal property and unto the said Edward Beaton his heirs executors and administrators for the following trust & purposes, that is to say that if the said Lawson Beal shall fail to pay unto the said James Jackson the debt aforesaid due him with interest which may accrue thereon, or any part of the said debt and interest when demanded, it shall and may be lawful for the said Edward Beaton for in case of his death for his legal personal representative who is hereby authorized & entreated to sign his name to this instrument to require by the said James Jackson his executors administrators or assigns to make sale of the property aforesaid for such sum as will pay unto the said Edward Beaton his heirs executors and assigns the sum of one hundred and ten dollars and pay and satisfy the debt of interest aforesaid or so much thereof as may be due at the time and the date and expenses attending such sale of this conveyance and the balance of any sum paid over to the said Lawson Beal his executors administrators & personal representatives. But if the said Lawson Beal shall fully pay & discharge the debt aforesaid by interest and otherwise when demanded, this Indenture to be null & void of force & effect.
