

Know all men by these presents that we Harrison Moore Elisha ^{Darden} & Edwin Harrison are hitherto and firmly bound unto David Campbell Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the past and full sum of Two thousands dollars, to be paid to the said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth for the payment whereof well and truly to be made we have ourselves and each of us our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators jointly and severally form by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 19th day of February 1838.

The foundation of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Harrison Moore has been duly appointed by the Court of Southampton County to serve as constable with the said County, to supply the vacancy created by the resignation of William Atkinson. Now if the said Harrison Moore shall well and truly discharge the duties of the office of constable in the said County during his continuance therein then this obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and effect.

This INDENTURE made and entered into this the day of January in the year 1838 between William Williams and Alice B. his Wife of the one part and Jesse Little of the other part, all of the County of Southampton. Witnesseth that the said William Williams and Alice B. his Wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred dollars lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Jesse Little at or before the enacting and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained and sold, confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Jesse Little his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid, bounded as follows, to wit: beginning at a scrub oak on side line on Joseph Drury's line, running thence a South West course to a Post omnium tree, fore and aft thence a straight line to a black gum, a new made corner tree in a small branch below the said William S. Williams & Jesse Little, thence down the said branch to a white oak, a corner between Jesse Little & Samuel James thence up the said branch & bounded by the lands of Samuel James & River Barber to a corner between the land hereby sold & Susanna Cobb, a black gum, thence a straight line to a white oak, a corner for Joseph Drury & Jesse Little in Mrs Cobb's line, thence a South course to a corner point for the said land and Joseph Drury, thence a straight line to the beginning, containing, by estimation one hundred acres be the same more or less, with all and singular the premises and appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of land belonging or in any way appertaining. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and premises with every of its appurtenances unto them the said Jesse Little his heirs and assigns forever. And the said William S. Williams & Alice B. his Wife for themselves their heirs, executors and administrators hereby covenant with the said Jesse Little his heirs executors and assigns that will warrant defend the title to the land hereby conveyed unto him the said Jesse Little his heirs and assigns against the claim of themselves the said William S. Williams and Alice B. his Wife and of every other person or persons whatever. In testimony whereof the said William S. Williams and Alice B. his Wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day and year before written.
