This Indenture made this 19th day of February A.D. One Thousand eight hundred and thirty eight
between Mills Pope and Peggy his wife of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the one part and John
Locke of said County & state of the other part witnesseth: that the said Mills Pope and Peggy his wife in
consideration of the sum of four hundred & forty eight dollars & 33/100 to them in hand paid by the said
John Locke at the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have bargained
and sold and by these presents do and each of them with bargain and sell unto the said John Locke his heirs
and assigns a certain parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing one hundred
and thirteen acres & $\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre and bounded as follows beginning at a Sassafras stub in Mr. Nicholson's
line land running N.E. & 150 paces to Peacock's Roads thence along said Roads to Benja Edwards et al.
thence along said line S.E. W. 142 paces to small red oak as new corner thence E. to the beginning. Lg. tree
with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining. It have and
hold the said parcel of land with all and singular other the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to
be bargained and sold with every of the rights members and appurtenances, unto the said John Locke his
heirs and assigns forever. And the said Mills Pope and Peggy his wife for themselves and their the said
parcel of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John
Locke his heirs and assigns free from all claims or demands of them the said Mills Pope and Peggy his wife
either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons what so ever shall, will,
or may at warrant and forever defend by these presents. In witness whereof the said Mills Pope and Peggy his
wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written.
