This Indenture made this eighth day of December in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred, and thirty six (1836) between Joseph Pottow and Elizabeth, his Wife, of the County of Surry and State of Virginia, of the one part and Milton S. Bevan of the County of Southampton, and State of Virginia, of the other part Witnesseth that the said Joseph Pottow and Elizabeth, his Wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand and fifty dollars, of lawful money of Virginia, to them in hand paid by the said Milton S. Bevan at or before the making and delivery of these presents of the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth, bargain and sell unto the said Milton S. Bevan his heirs and assigns two tracts or parcels of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Southampton: The one tract lying on both sides of Porters Road containing, by estimation Three hundred acres (be the same more or less): the other tract, lying west of Porters Road, containing, by estimation about twelve acres (be the same more or less) and known by the name of "Coleman's" - the whole bounded by the lands of Robert Pottow, Ransom S. Howell, Joseph Pottow and and the lands belonging to the estate of Major Edward Bailey, died with all and singular the premises and appurtenances, and the several and several, remained and remaineth, yearly, and other rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tracts or parcels of lands, with the tenements, hereditaments of all and singular other the premises, herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold, and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members and appurtenances unto the said Milton S. Bevan, his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Joseph Pottow, and Elizabeth, his wife, for themselves and their heirs the said tracts or parcels of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Milton S. Bevan, his heirs and assigns, free from the claim or claims of them the said Joseph Pottow and Elizabeth his Wife or either of them, their or either of their heirs and of all and every person whatsoever shall, will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents.
