Ferguson, have, for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Lewis G. Ferguson at the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold unto by these presents doth hereby grant bargain and sell unto him the said Lewis G. Ferguson all the right, title, interest and estate which he the said Collier J. Ferguson now has or ever may hereafter have in and to the lands and slaves of which his father Deacon Ferguson of the said County of Southampton since deceased and deceased, To have and to hold the said interest, in so full extent, as to the free simple estate thereon to him the said Lewis G. Ferguson his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim of him the said Collier J. Ferguson his heirs and assigns, and also free from the claim of all and every person and persons whatsoever, hereby in like manner warranting and extending the title of in and to the said interest, in said lands and slaves to him the said Lewis G. Ferguson his heirs and assigns forever against the claim of himself, his heirs and assigns and also against the claim of all and every person and persons whatsoever. B. beginning) at the fork of Ready, held branch just below the old Miller's place thence up said branch to George Harris's line thence along said Harris's line to Walter G. Brittle's line, thence along said Brittle's line to a small shack or branch that leads from the long fence to Ready held branch thence down said branch to the beginning. To have and to hold the said tract of land to him the said Henry Ellis his heirs or assigns to their proper use and behoof until Edward J. Brittle shall become sufficient through or by the maladministration of Albert Andrews some of whose names and at which time said Brittle may sell the said tract of land under and other deeds executed to Roberton Arch.
