L Jones of the said County, the receipt whereof I hereby acknowledge, have bargained and sold and by these  
presents do bargain and sell unto the said Thomas L Jones his executors administrators and assigns forever all  
my right title and interests in the Negro slaves and other property which I owned, or rights of my late wife Sally  
Blythe from the estate of her father George Lamp and which said slaves and now in the possession of the widow of the  
said George Lamp, and held by her, for life, as servient in his estate, and any interest I may acquire in the same as  
administrator of my said deceased wife. And I do hereby warrant and defend the title of the above  
described property to the said Thomas L Jones his executors administrators and assigns forever, against the claim of all  
my executors, administrators or assigns, and against the claims of all and every person whatsoever. In witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth day of March in the year 1838.

is indebted to James S. French by bond bearing date day of March 1838 in the sum of \$200 or more with  
interest from an earliest day as will appear by the note aforesaid and memorandum by led. Wm. Parker etc  
Item forth more fully. The amount of the debt as well as for the further consideration of \$35 to him in hand  
Exam & paid by the said William R. Edwards at or before the sealing) and delivering of these presents, the receipt whereof  
to G. H. Edwards is hereby acknowledged, and whereas also the said A. P. Peete is now about to make a deed of trust for the pur-  
chase of running Manufac't'ry Peete, George H. Peete and Martha N. Dillard special brokers as likewise his creditors gene-  
rally and is anxious that the debt due James S. French shall be placed on the same footing with the debts and trusts of  
Peete, George H. Peete and Martha N. Dillard this Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said A. P. Peete has freely  
bargained, granted, sold, aliened and conveyed to William R. Edwards and by these presents does grant, bargain sell &  
convey unto the said Edwards all right title and interest, whether present, in remainder or reversion, which the  
said A. P. Peete has in and to the following slaves which he inherits from his son (William A. Peete to wit) Jacob  
Henry, Albert, Jack Polley and Minorus and their children, which he receives from Charlotte Nicholson by act of gift  
to have and to hold the same to the said William R. Edwards his heirs and assigns forever; upon trusts nevertheless that in  
the event of the said French requiring payment of the note aforesaid, then owing, and excepting one year from the date  
of this deed the said A. P. Edwards shall when required by the said French, advertise and sell at public auction, non  
able notice being given enough of the property, herein conveyed to satisfy the said French his debt interest and expense  
of sale and the residue falling over to said French who will apply it as requires to do by the deed of trust of which he  
is trustee. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this day and date above written.
