And I do hereby warrant and defend the title of the title of the above described property to the said Thomas la Jones his executors administrators and assigns forever, against the claims of my executors administrators or assigns and against the claims of all and every person whatsoever. Peete setting forth more fully the amount of the debt as well as for the further consideration of \$50 to him in hand paid by the said William R. Edwards at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof to L. R. Edwards is hereby acknowledged, and whereas also the said A. P. Peete is now about to make a deed of trust for the purpose of securing Mark P. Peete, George M. Peete and Martha A. Dilland special creditors as likewise his creditors generally and is anxious that the debt due James L. French shall be paid on the same footing with the debt and Mark P. Peete, George M. Peete and Martha A. Dilland this Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said A. P. Peete has hereby bargained, granted, sold, aliened and conveyed to William R. Edwards and by these presents does grant bargain sell, alien and convey unto the said Edwards all right title and interest, whether present or to come which the said A. P. Peete has in and to the following slaves which he inherited from his son William A. Peete to wit: Lewis Henry, Albert, Jack Polley, and Minerva and their children, which he received from Charlotte Nicholson by deed of gift to have and to hold the same to the said William R. Edwards his heirs and assigns forever upon trusts mentioned that in the event of the said French requiring payment of the note aforesaid, then saving and excepting one year from the date of this deed the said W. R. Edwards shall when required by the said French, advertise and sell at public auction, some able notes being given enough of the property here in conveyed to pay the said French his debt interest and expenses of sale and the residue pay over to said French who will apply it as requires to do by the deed of trust of which he is trustee.
