This Indenture made this seventh day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Thirty seven between Sterling Sledge and Hasty his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and James Drury of the same County, of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Sterling Sledge and Hasty his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of twenty dollars lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said James Drury, as or before the sealing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof the said Sterling Sledge and Hasty his wife, doth hereby acknowledge, and therby doth clearly exonerate, acquit and discharge the said James Drury, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns and every of them forever by these presents) they the said Sterling Sledge and Hasty, his wife, hath granted, bargained, sold, alienated, enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and confirm unto the said James Drury, his heirs and assigns forever all that parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton containing five acres, to the same more or less and bounded on the North by the main Road leading from Jerusalem to Believel, on the east, west and south by the lands belonging to James Drury and all the recoveries or reversions, remainders or remainances of all & singular the said parcel of land hereby granted or mentioned to be granted and of every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said parcel of land hereby granted bargained and sold unto the said James Drury his heirs & assigns forever to the on top proper use and behoof of him the said James Drury, his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Sterling Sledge and Hasty his wife doth hereby grants for them and their heirs that they the said Sterling Sledge and Hasty his wife and their heirs the said parcel of land hereby granted or mentioned to be granted and every parcel thereof, with all and singular their and every of their rights, members and appurtenances unto the said James Drury his heirs and assigns against whom the said Sterling Sledge and Hasty his wife and their heirs, and against all and every other person and persons. Whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. Lamp of the other part, all of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia, witnesseth, that for and in consideration of six hundred & fifty nine dollars & fifty cents to them on hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained & sold and by these presents, do grants, bargain & sell unto George B. Lamp his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows, to begin at the intersection of the Roads leading from Boykin's bridge to the X Road & a large branch below the main branch, a new corner for William D Phillips in 14th Street (Williams's land, thence along said Road 14 poles, thence S. 6° E. 11 poles then N. 68 1/2° E. 16 poles, thence S. 33 1/2° E. 22 poles, thence S. 23° E. 18 poles, thence S. 29 1/2° E. 17 poles to the other Road, thence along the other Road S.
