

Upon trusts nevertheless that the said James Maget shall permit the said Robt Williams to remain in quiet possession of the aforesaid property, conveyed and the profits, and the profits to his own use until default be made in the payments either in whole or in parts, and then upon the further trusts that the said James Maget shall and will so soon after the happening of such default of payments as him the said Robt Williams shall request, sell the said property hereby conveyed or such parts thereof as the said trustee hereby authorized shall think sufficient for the purpose, to the highest bidder, for ready money at public auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at his own discretion and given ten days notice thereof by advertisement, and out of the moneys arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expenses attending the same pay to the said Robt Williams the said sum here before named with the interests which may have accrued thereon, and the balance if any shall pay to the said Robt Williams his heirs execs admors or assigns, but if the whole of the said sum before mentioned shall be paid off and discharged to the said Robt Williams, then this indenture to be void, or otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

Griffin of the same County and State of the other part (Mingleth) that the said Joel Broadshaw and Polly, his Wife, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars, current money, to them in hand paid, by the said Benjamin I. Griffin, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed, and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell, unto the said Benjamin I. Griffin his heirs and assigns forever, all their dower rights in the lands of Jesse Williams decd: which same contains 140 acres in the whole, and the sd. Polly Broadshaw formerly Polly Williams's dower right, contains 33 1/2 acres (and of labor by proper metes and bounds as will more fully appear by having reference to the report of the Commissioners who laid off her dower which report is on record in the County Court of Southampton Virginia. To have and to hold the same unto the said Benjamin I. Griffin his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Joel Broadshaw and Polly his Wife, for themselves, their heirs, executors administrators and assigns, doth by these presents, covenants and grants to and with the said Benjamin I. Griffin his heirs and assigns that they will by these presents warrant, and forever defend, all lawful title, claim and demand of any person claiming, or demanding) the same, or any parts or parts thereof, doth hereby warrant, defend, and defend their hands and affixes their seals, this day and year above written
