

Whereas Lemuel P. Nicholson and William Griffin have undertaken the rebuilding of two small bridges on the South side of Millbury River near Jerusalem for the sum of three hundred and four dollars, and Whereas Benjamin Devany and the said Nicholson are the securities of the said ^{Griffin} for a debt due to Joseph Joyner and one due to William Joyner. - And the said (William Griffin being) willing to secure the said Devany & Nicholson from any loss whatever on account of their securityship, do hereby assign ^{and} transfer his interests in the aforesaid sum, ^{and} this is to say, one hundred and fifty two dollars, being one half, to the said Devany & Nicholson and do hereby authorize and request the County Court of South Hampshire to buy the said sum for the benefit of the said Devany & Nicholson. This is intended as an additional security to the said Devany and Nicholson to the debt of trust heretofore given & Recovered for their indemnity. Given under my hand and seal this 21st day of March 1858.

Holmes, was, on the 16th day of October 1837, by the School Commissioners in and for the County of Southampton, appointed their treasurer for the year ending on the 31st day of December 1838. Now if the said Samuel H. Holmes shall faithfully apply and account for all moneys which may come to his hands by virtue of his office and shall perform and execute all and every act and thing appertaining to his office according to Law then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue
