This Indenture made This 6th sixth day of February 1837 between John H. Darden the trustee
of the first part, Benjamin Travis (the debtor) of the second part and Frances Lenow Executrix of Henry Lenow,
and, the creditor of the third part; Thomas the said Benjamin Travis on the first day of March in the year of
one thousand eight hundred and thirty four in order to secure the payment of the sum of Two
hundred dollars due by him to the said Frances Lenow Executrix of Henry Lenow decd. as by Indenture of
that date convey to the said John H. Darden his Exors. &c as certain tract or parcel of land lying and being
in the County of Southampton in the state of Virginia, containing by estimation one hundred and sixty
acres the same more or less and bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at a corner on the North by the lands of
John N. Bonnich, on the West by the lands formerly belonging to William West being the same land the said
Benjamin Travis purchased of his father and on the East by the land of James Lenow and on the South by
John Ricketts, together with all the houses, lands, tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said lands
(belonging or appertaining), upon trust, for the uses and purposes in the said Indenture mentioned. And whereas
since the executing and delivery of the said deed of trust, the said Benjamin Travis hath fully satisfied
and paid to the said Frances Lenow Executrix of Henry Lenow decd. the sum of money thereby secured, which
the said Frances Lenow &c doth hereby acknowledge. Now This Indenture witnesseth, that for the con-
sideration aforesaid as well as for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Benjamin
Travis to the said John H. Darden at and before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said John H. Darden, with the assent and approbation of the said Frances
Lenow Executrix of Henry Lenow decd signified by her being party to these presents, and the said
Frances Lenow Executrix of Henry Lenow decd have granted bargained and sold remissey released and confirmed
as by these presents to grant, bargain and sell remise release and confirm unto the said Benjamin Travis all the
estate, right, title, interest, claim and demands both at law, and equity, which the said John H. Darden and
Frances Lenow Executrix of Henry Lenow decd. have or have in the lands &c above described. To have and to hold
the said tract or parcel of land &c to the said Benjamin Travis his heirs executors, administrators and assigns
forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Benjamin Travis his heirs executors, administrators
and assigns forever (to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Benjamin Travis his heirs executors, administrators
and assigns forever). And the said John H. Darden and Frances Lenow Executrix of Henry Lenow, and for
themselves their heirs executors and administrators, the above mentioned lands unto the said Benjamin Travis
his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever in as full and ample manner as the same was un-
derwritten by the said Benjamin Travis by virtue of trust above recited as warrant, the same to the said Ben-
jamin Travis against the claims or claims of them the said John H. Darden and Frances Lenow Executrix of Hen-
ry Lenow and any all persons claiming by or under them or either of them. In witness whereof the parties
