This Indenture made this 6th day of October in the year of our Lord Christ 1837 between Abigail  
Broadshaw and his wife Martha Broadshaw of the one part and Willis Broadshaw all of the County of Southampton from  
& Notwya & State of Virginia. It comfitts that the said Abington Broadshaw & Martha his wife, in consideration  
of the sum of eighty five dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said willis  
Broadshaw as or before the concluding & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknow-  
ledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents so bargained and sold unto the said Willis Broad-  
shaw his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land & premises containing by estimation one hundred  
& twenty six acres more or less, its being that portion of land that was laid off by commissioners to the said Abington  
Broadshaw in right of his wife Martha, out of the land of her first Husband Benjamin Broadshaw which is all of
