This Indenture made this eleventh day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight, between Timothy T. Barham of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first party, Mr. Prince Jr. of the same County and State of the second party, and S. V. J. Drewry of the said County and State of the third party; Whereas the said Timothy T. Barham is justly indebted to the said S. V. J. Drewry in the sum of fifty one dollars and Twenty cents as by account, bearing date with these presents: which debt the said Timothy T. Barham is willing and anxious to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar to the said Timothy T. Barham in hand paid by the said Mr. Prince Jr. to and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed released and ungrimed, and by these presents doth grant, bar- gain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release and confirm to the said Mr. Prince Jr. his heirs and assigns forever the following property, to wit, one barrel Mare and both, six head cattle and one top gig and one shot gun, and one pair carb- ulets, to have and to hold the property hereby conveyed to the said Mr. Prince Jr. his heirs or assigns forever. Upon this notwithstanding that the said Mr. Prince Jr. his heirs executors and administrators shall permit the said Timothy T. Barham to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the property hereby conveyed and take the profits thereof to his own use until default be made in the payment of the sum of fifty one dollars and Twenty cents and then upon this further trust, that he or his heirs, execs. adms. or assigns shall and will so soon after the happening of such default, as he or his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns may think proper or the said S. V. J. Drewry, their heirs executors, administrators or assigns shall require, sell the said property, hereby conveyed or such parts of the hereby conveyed property as the trustee or his representative, hereby authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purpose and shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at publick auction after having fixed the time and place of such sale at their own discretion and given, not less than fifteen days notice and out of the mes- nis arising from such sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof, and all the expenses attending the fore- mises pay to the said S. V. J. Drewry, their heirs executors adms. or assigns the sum of Fifty one dollars and Twenty cents with the interest which may thereon have lawfully accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the said Timothy T. Barham his heirs executors administrators or assigns but if the whole of the sum of fifty one dollars and Twenty cents shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said S. V. J. Drewry, their executors, administrators or assigns on or before the twenty fifth day of December next, when the same is payable so that no default of payment of the said sum of fifty one dollars and Twenty cents be made then this indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
