of her late husband Francis P. Pond deceased, also my right title and interest in and to said slaves which  
my son, daughter Catherine Millons is entitled to, who survived her half brother Francis P. Pond and his wife James B.  
Millons, for himself his heirs executors and administrators, warrants and affidavits theright to the said Edward Butts his
