Bond son of Calthrop Bond decd, also my right title and interest in and to said slaves which my said daughter Catharine Millons is entitled to; who survived her half brother Francis P. Bond and the said James B. Millons for himself, his heirs executors and administrators, warrants and assigns the rights to the said Edward Butts his heirs executors, assigns.
