This Indenture made this twenty fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight between William M. Myrick of the first part, Henry Pittway who has been mutually chosen trustee of the same part and Daniel R. Balls of the third part, all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia Minors, that the said Daniel R. Balls is bound as security for the said William M. Myrick to a bond executed to Benjamin Denny Curator of the estate of William M. Rochelle decd. for the sum of eighty five dollars due the 31st day of December 1837 and the said William M. Myrick being willing and desirous to secure the said Daniel R. Balls for any loss he may sustain by reason of said securityship. This Indenture therefore Minors that the said William M. Myrick as well in consideration of the foregoing, as of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by and before the executing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) and from every part of debt the said Henry Pittway and all his legal representatives are forever released exonerated and discharged both to say granted forgiven and sold unto the said Henry Pittway (trustee aforesaid) all his right title and interest in and to the estate of his father William Myrick decd. consisting of slaves to wit a negro man named Jordan and a negro woman named Jincy also a tract of land containing by estimation three hundred and thirty six acres (more or less) also all the right he has may or can have of in & to said slaves Jordan & Jincy by virtue of a once made for him by his brother Joshua J. Myrick (as per bill of sale bearing) date 10th day of March 1835 and this day transferred to the said Henry Pittway trustee aforesaid To have and to hold the said negro slaves and land and all the right title interest and estate whatsoever of him the said William M. Myrick of and to the said Henry Pittway his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever. In testimony whereof the said William M. Myrick shall seal to pay the sum of eighty five dollars with all cost and interest according to law when required to be paid by the said Benjamin Denny Curator as aforesaid or his assigns (that the said Henry Pittway shall if required by the said Daniel R. Balls in writing) upon any public sale to the highest bidder for cash Virginia money at Keopers the Store in the County of Southampton or any where said trust or parcel of land lies in and
