This Indenture made this twenty fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight
between William H. Myrick of the first part, Henry Pittway who has been mutually chosen trustee of the sum of
and Daniel R. Butts of the other parts all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia witnesseth that whereas
the said Daniel R. Butts is bound as security for the said William H. Myrick to a bond executed to Benjamin
Devany Curator of the estate of William H. Richells deceased for the sum of eighty five dollars on the 25th day of
December 1837 and the said William H. Myrick being willing and desirous to secure the said Daniel R. Butts for
any loss he may sustain by reason of said securityship. This Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said William
H. Myrick as well in consideration of the premises, as of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by and before
the executing and delivering of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) and from every just debt to
H. Pittway to the said Henry Pittway and all his legal representatives are forever released unexecuted and discharged both to
day givent as bargaines and sold unto the said Henry Pittway (trustee of前述) all his right title and interest
in and to the estate of his father William Myrick dead consisting of slaves to wit a negro man named Jordan
and a negro woman named Jincy also a tract of land containing by estimation three hundred and thirty six
acres more or less; also all the right he has may or can have of us to said slaves Jordan & Jincy by virtue of
a will made to him by his brother Joshua T. Myrick, as per bill of sale bearing date 10th day of March 1835
and this day transferred to the said Henry Pittway trustee aforesaid. To have and to hold the said my
slaves over land and all the right title interest and estate whatsoever of him the said William H. Myrick of us
to the said. To him the said Henry Pittway his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever. In trust notwithstanding that if
the said William H. Myrick shall fail to pay the sum of Eighty five dollars with all cost and interest accruing thereon
when required to be paid by the said Benjamin Devany Curator as aforesaid or his assigns then the said Henry Pitt-
way shall be entitled to require by the said Daniel R. Butts in writing, expense by public sale to the highest bidder for such
Virginia money at Cooper's Old Store in the County of Southampton over where said trust or parcel of land lie in and
