Therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said Benjamin Griffin Sheriff as aforesaid for and in consideration of the said sum of three hundred and forty eight dollars & 48c to him in hand paid by the said Jeremiah Cobb at or before the sealing & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold & conveyed and with hereby bargain sold, transferred and conveyed unto the said Jeremiah Cobb all the said Edmund Halcombs individual interest in the lands of which his father Richard and Halcomb died seized & possessed also the tract of land on which the said Edmund Halcomb at the time of taking the oath of insolvency lived (except the ten acres aforesaid) containing one hundred and fifty acres. And the said Benjamin Griffin Sheriff as aforesaid hereby covenants to warrant to the said Jeremiah Cobb the said Edmund Halcombs interest and title to the land above mentioned, such title and such title only as the said Griffin as Sheriff is authorized by law to convey. Louise B his wife in consideration of six hundred & seventy five dollars lawful money of the
Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Peter Edwards, at or before the sealing &
delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged). Have bargained & sold and
by these presents do and each of them with warranty & all unto the said Peter Edwards his heirs & of
signs an undivided moiety of a certain tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and twenty
five acres (situate & lying) in the County of Southampton adjoining the lands of the said Peter Ed-
wards & John A. Morris together with all and singular the tennements, hereditaments and appurte-
nances appertaining & belonging unto the said undivided moiety of the tract of land aforesaid.
To have and to hold the said two hundred & twenty five acres of land, with the tennements her-
editaments & appurtenances belonging unto the said Peter Edwards his heirs and assigns forever but
the said Samuel J. Douglas and Louise B his wife, for themselves and their heirs the said un-
divided moiety of two hundred & twenty five acres, with all and singular the premises aforesaid
Tennants before mentioned unto the said Peter Edwards his heirs & assigns free from the claim
or claims of them, the said Samuel J. Douglas and Louise B his wife or either of them, their
or either of their heirs & of all & every person or persons whatsoever shall, will and do warranty
