

This Indenture made and entered into this the 18th day of June 1838 between William Griffin and his wife Virginia his wife of the first part, James S French & of the second part, and Cavin Harrison and R. Edwards of the third party - all of the County of Southampton. Whereas the said Cavin Harrison and R. Edwards have become security to the said William Griffin in a note or bond for one hundred dollars due and owing on the 18th day of June 1838 and made payable to John M. Gurney and whereas the said Griffin is willing and desirous to indemnify the said Harrison & Edwards from all and every loss whatever which they may sustain in consequence of the said securityship. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said William Griffin and Virginia his wife for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said James S French at or before the concluding and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell and convey unto the said James S French his heirs and assigns the following property, to wit, the said Griffin & wife's undivided interest in a tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres belonging to the late of John Holmes and lying and being in the County aforesaid - also six head of cattle, eight head of hoggs, one riding saddle, one shot gun, one side board, one block, one set of Minot's chairs, two walnut tables, parcel of books, set of Shoemakers tools and shop furniture and all his, the said Griffin's stock of leather, shoes &c on hand. To have and to hold the said Griffin & wife's undivided interest in the tract of land aforesaid, together with the other property aforesaid, and the increase of the stock unto him the said James S French his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said James S French his heirs and assigns forever. Upon the following trust and confidence, that is to say that the said James S French upon being requested so to do by the said Harrison & Edwards or either of them or the Cavers or amrs. of either of them - they having good reason to believe that they are likely to be in consequence of their securityship aforesaid - shall after having given reasonable notice of the time and place of sale (fixed upon in his own discretion) sell at public auction for each the interest of the said Griffin & wife in the tract of land aforesaid together with the other property above mentioned and out of the money arising from such sale pay and satisfy all costs of expenses attending the sale of the same, then pay & satisfy the debts aforesaid of interest thereon, to which the said Harrison & Edwards are security or pay & satisfy the said Harrison and Edwards or either of them or the executors administrators of them, such sums with interest thereon as they or either of them shall have been compelled to pay as security aforesaid.
