On Indenture made this 16th day of July in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty five between William Mallory of the first part, Lewis Lunford of the second part, and Samuel H. Marks of the third part, Whereas the said Mallory is justly indebted to the said marks as follows viz: by a single bill for \$55.41. dated 25th Sept 1832 & payable on demand with interest from date; by a certain other single bill signed by "Bonner & Mallory" for \$106.95 payable in like manner on which a credit is endorsed for \$21.72 paid March 13th 1833; and also in the further sum of \$54.78 due by open act. and where as the said Marks is special Bailiff of the said Mallory in two suits instituted against him in the City Court of Pittsburg by T. B. Bond &c. for which liability he is willing to save him harm by this Indenture. Now the Indenture witnesseth that the said William Mallory in consideration of the promises and of the sum of one dollar to him by the said Trustee in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold confined and made over; and doth by these presents bargain and sell confine and make over unto the said Lewis Lunford the following property of effects, viz, Two certain lots and tenements situated on the west side of Halifax street on the town of Pittsburg bounded on the north
