of the one part and Louisa Lenow of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Jacob Lenow
& his wife for an in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars to them
in hand paid by the said Louisa Lenow the receipt whereof the said Jacob Lenow and
his wife doth hereby acknowledge and themselves fully satisfied and paid and of the same
doth by these presents acquit the said Louisa Lenow they the said Jacob Lenow and his wife
has granted bargained and sold. aliened enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents do
grant bargain and sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Louisa Lenow. One certain
tract plantation or parcel of land containing by estimation One hundred acres be the
tract plantation or parcel of land containing by estimation One hundred acres be the
same more or less lying and being situate in the County of Southampton Va the said land
is subject to the dower of Frances Lenow, and being the power tract devised to the said Jacob
Lenow by his father Henry Lenow died in his last will - and the same land said H. Lenow
purchased of Samuel & John Power, with all the singular appurtenances thereto belonging
or in any wise appertaining with the reversion and reversions remaines and remainders
unto the heirs and profits thereof. To have and to hold the said bargained premises with the
appurtenances unto the said Louisa Lenow her heirs and assigns forever. and the said Jacob
Lenow and his wife for themselves their heirs &c. the said bargained premises and every
part and parcel thereof with their appurtenances, clear exempt and secure from all claim
or other Incumbrances whatsoever unto the said Louisa Lenow her heirs &c. against all
and every person or persons whatsoever, does shall and will by these presents given
