Wick of the first part James Wick brother of the second part & John Maddelle & John Wick creditors of the third part being all residents of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia except John Maddelle who is resident of that County in themselves. Witnesseth that whereas the said Joseph A. Wick stands justly indebted to the said John Maddelle & John Wick in the sum of two thousand one hundred & twenty six dollars & thirty two cents due by bond bearing date the nineteenth of March 1838 & bearing interest from 3rd day of January 1838. which debt he the said Joseph A. Wick honestly desires to secure and pay unto the said John Maddelle & John Wick. In consideration thereof and in further consideration of the sum of one dollar he the said Joseph in hand paid by the said James Wick before the signing sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Joseph does hereby acknowledge. In testimony whereof the said Joseph has hereunto set his hand and seals and given granted bargained sold & delivered to the said James Wick his heirs and assigns for the purpose hereinafter mentioned one certain tract or parcel of land lying & being in the County of Southampton & State of Virginia Bounded by the lands of John Duggan and by the lands of Liza Wick by the lands of John Wick & by the lands of Mary T. Wick and by the said Joseph containing three hundred & sixty acres more or less also one certain tract or parcel of land & water mill being the same that was given & devised to the said Joseph
