Whereas David Godwin hath been availed by the Sheriff of Southampton County under a writ of *habeas corpus et satisfaciendum* issued from the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for the said County in favour of John D Hart and being desirous to avail himself of the privilege of an writ sent docket hath subscribed and delivered in a schedule of his estate and made oath thereto according to law in which schedule among other things is contained the following. (My interest in a tract of land in Mansfield County supposed to be about four hundred acres of land which I hold a reversionary interest in in right of my wife after the death of her another Margaret Kelly - and previous to the said David Godwin's discharge from custody he is required to convey his interest in the tract of land aforesaid to the Sheriff of Mansfield County according to law. Now therefore this Indenture sheweth that the said David Godwin for and in consideration of the premises hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto Archibald Allen Sheriff of the County of Mansfield; his the said Godwin's interest in a tract of land in Mansfield County supposed to contain about four hundred acres which he holds in right of his wife after the death of her as the Margaret Kelly. To have and to hold the said interest unto him the said Archibald Allen Sheriff as aforesaid his heirs and assigns. To the only proper use and behoof of him the said Archibald Allen Sheriff as aforesaid his heirs and assigns forever - And the said David Godwin hereby warrants and covenants the interest hereby conveyed or intended to be conveyed unto him the said Archibald Allen Sheriff as aforesaid his heirs and assigns against the claim of him the said David Godwin and of all and every other person or persons whomsoever. In Testimony whereof the said David Godwin hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this 23rd day of October 1831

This Indenture made this Twenty Second day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Twenty two by and between Edwin F. Hunt and Sally his wife of Southampton County and state of Virginia of the one part and Jesse Parker of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Edwin F. Hunt and Sally his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand dollars to them in hand paid by the said Jesse Parker, at and before the executing and signing of these Presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; they the said Edwin F. Hunt and Sally his wife for themselves their heirs executors and administrators have granted bargained sold, allotted and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell, allot and confirm unto them the said Jesse Parker and to his heirs and assigns forever, a certain set of land lying in the County of Southampton aforesaid, in the lower end of Liberty parish; which is made up and composed of three separate tracts, which were purchased by and occupied by the late Richmond Dillard died as follows to wit, one tract from him and Elizabeth his wife of one hundred acres, (more or less) including the dwelling house Orchard Garden &c.) as appears by their deed bearing date the seventeenth day of Sept. umber one thousand eight hundred and Eleven; one other tract from the same of Fifty one acres (more or less) including the Mill, Mill Pond &c. as appears by their deed of equal date with the above; and one other tract from James Carr and Ann his wife, of Sixty four acres (more or less) as per their deed bearing date the nineteenth
