This Indenture made the twenty ninth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight between Jacob I Williams and Eliza his wife of the County of Southampton at aforesaid of the one part, and North Pauls of the County of Southampton in the state of Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Jacob I Williams of Eliza his wife for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said North Pauls at and before the executing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) they the said Jacob I Williams and Eliza his wife have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth grant bargain & sell unto the said North Pauls his heirs and assigns forever. all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton in the state aforesaid known by the name of "Franklin" containing by estimation one hundred & twenty three acres be the same more or less and adjoining the lands of James McBlenny Elizabeth Johnson, and Black water River being the same tract or parcel of land which the said Jacob I Williams purchased from Allen Daughtrey and wife, and recorded in the clerk's office of Southampton County Court as well appear by reference thereto together with all and singular the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders joint and several and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of the appurtenances unto the said North Pauls his heirs and assigns forever. (To the only proper use and behoof of him the said North Pauls his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Jacob I Williams and Eliza his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract or parcel of land, with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said North Pauls his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said Jacob I Williams of Eliza his wife or either of them, their or either of their heirs and of all & every other person or persons whatsoever shall will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents.
