This Indenture made and entered into this the 12th day of November AD 1838 between
Alexander Myrick Executor of the last Will and Testament of James Scammell deceased which record
of the County Court of Southampton of the one part and W^m. H. Mason of the other part namely
that the said Alexander Myrick Executor as aforesaid by virtue of the power in him vested by the last Will
Testament of the said James Scammell deceased did set up and sell to the highest bidder the tract of
land of which the said James Scammell died seized and possessed and on which he resided at the
time of his death containing Three hundred and Sixty Two and a half acres more or less and the
said W^m. H. Mason became the purchaser thereof at the price of Eleven hundred dollars where
therefore the said Alexander Myrick Executor aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of
Eleven hundred dollars to him secured to be paid, at or before the unselling and
delivery of these presents, hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth
give grant bargain and sell unto the said W^m. H. Mason his heirs and assigns the above
