An agreement made and entered into this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of Nov. one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight between Lucy T. Wiggins of the City of Southampton State of North Carolina of the one part and T. J. Mahone of the County of Southampton State of Va. of the other part witnesseth that whereas the said Lucy T. Wiggins being and heir to a proportionable part of the monies arising from the sale of certain negroes which negroes were apportioned the late attorney Drake deceased as set down of the slaves of the estate of his husband Jeremiah Drake deceased which slaves the said Jeremiah Drake did seize and possessed of which were sold yesterday at public auction by Jas. S. French Compt. for the benefit of the heirs now the said Lucy T. Wiggins being desirous to dispose of her said interest in the monies from the sale of said negroes which she is owing, be entituled to as one of the heirs thereto by these presents for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five dollars to her in hand paid by the said T. J. Mahone at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents hereto bearing full conveyance and confirmed unto him the said T. J. Mahone all of the before mentioned interest which the said Lucy T. Wiggins is or may be entitled to in the before named undivided monies arising from the lands of T. J. Commissioned of the sale of said negroes to him the said T. J. Mahone his heirs &c. to have and to hold with all interest or benefits arising therefrom whatsoever and she the said Lucy T. Wiggins for herself her heirs Execut or assigns with by these presents to convey and agree to and with the said T. J. Mahone his heirs &c. she the said Lucy T. Wiggins her heirs Execut or assigns shall well and truly by these presents forever warrant and give the right and title of said interest to him the said T. J. Mahone his heirs &c. against the claims or demands demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof the said Lucy T. This Indenture made this 25<sup>th</sup> day of Nov. in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty eight between Lucy T. Wiggins of the County of Southampton State of North Carolina of the one part and T. J. Mahone of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the other part witnesseth that the said Lucy T. Wiggins for and in consideration of the sum of fifty dollars Lawful money of the State of Va. to her in hand paid by the said T. J. Mahone at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents to her receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents with grant bargained and sold and delivered unto the said T. J. Mahone his heirs and assigns the following described parcels of Land (No. 3) one fourth part of the undivided land formerly land which her late Draker Deed died seized and possessed of it being the same tract of land which was allotted to the before mentioned Martin Draker in the division of his late Father James Jeremiah Draker about the year 1826 as may be seen by reference to the survey report in the clerks office of Southampton County 1826 and containing by estimation about three acres of land the same more or less; and all interest which she the said Lucy T. Wiggins has or may have in the above land allotted to Henry Draker and the division of the lands of her late husband Jeremiah Draker which she Lucy T. Wiggins became heir to by the death of said late Draker Henry Draker Eliza Brooks formerly Eliza Draker and Henry Draker his mother do have and to hold the said tract or parcels of land within the aforesaid boundaries & limits belonging to and to the other person and that of him the said T. J. Mahone his heirs and assigns forever unto him the said T. J. Mahone his heirs and assigns forever and the said Lucy T.
