hundred and fifty dollars of lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Harrison
Turney at or before the concluding and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
both given granted bargained and sold and by these presents does give grant bargains
and conveys unto the said Harrison Turney a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in
the County aforesaid containing by estimation Sixty two and a half acres to the same more or less
being the same tract or parcel of Land devised to the said Anthony Vaughn by the last will and
testament of his Father Shadrack Vaughn which is on record in the County Court of Southampton
Town bounded by the lands of Thomas Vaughan Elbridge Cobb and others hereunto together
all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of Land and promises belonging
or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land and
promises with its appurtenances unto him the said Harrison Turney his heirs or assigns to the
only proper use and behoof of him the said Harrison Turney his heirs or assigns forever
and the said Anthony Vaughn for himself his heirs &c hereby covenants and agrees to and
with the said Harrison Turney his heirs or assigns that he will warrant and forever defend
the right and title to the before mentioned tract or parcel of Land and promises w^t the
appurtenances unto him the said Harrison Turney his heirs and assigns against the
claims or demands of himself the said Anthony Vaughn and of all and every person or persons

in and sell unto the said Thomas Hunter his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying
and being in the County of aforesaid containing Twenty acres it being the second of land which was allotted to the
said of Thomas Hunter late and known as a part of said land of Hunter and is bounded as follow (but)
on the north by Black Creek and the east by lands of Boyal on the south and west by Thomas Hunter lands to
have and to hold the said land and promises unto the said Thomas Hunter and his heirs until the decease of said
Henry Drury and wife together with all the preverledges orchards houses and waterways wherover belon

themselves their heirs and assigns do warrant and defend the said right for life unto the said Thomas Hunter
