This Indenture made this 21st day of Janry in the year Eighteen hundred and Thirty nine between James Mclemore of the one part & Edwin B. Blaine of the second part Witnesseth that the said James Mclemore being justly indebted to Benj^m Williamson of Southampton County in the sum of Twelve hundred and eighty one dollars 12/100 due by note bearing date the 19th day of December 1836 and the said James Mclemore being willing & desirous to secure the payment of the same to the said Benj^m Williamson or his heirs and consideration wherof & more considered and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid this receipt wherof is hereby fully acknowledged the said James Mclemore hath given granted and sold by by these presents with full conveyance and make over unto the said Edwin B. Blaine his or Exors^r the following property to wit one tract of land containing four hundred and eighty four 1/2 acres be the same more or less it being the land which the said James Mclemore purchased of William Rose To have and to hold the same also one good horse and one bay mare unto Edwin B. Blaine his heirs & assigns for the express purpose of paying the said Benj^m Williamson the said sum of Twelve hundred and eighty one dollars & 12/100 or as before the 19th day of Oct^r 1840 Then the said Benj^m Williamson shall be at full liberty when it may suit him to require and compel the said Edwin B. Blaine to take into his possession the aforesaid property and after advertising the same and place of sale for at least ten days at three publick places convenient to the said Mclemore's residence to sell for ready money, the all the property named in this tract deed and the said Edwin B. Blaine shall have full power and authority to make over and writing a lawful original and title to the purchaser of the said property & the said James Mclemore shall forever be estopped from setting up any claim to the same either in Law or equity & the money arising from the sale shall first be applied to the payment of the said debt due the said Benjamin Williamson with all interest now or cost thereon accruing and the balance if any to be paid unto the said Mclemore or his heirs and if the said Mclemore pay the said sum with all interest and cost thereon at any time before the said property is sold in manner before mentioned then this Indenture to be void and all original title and interest here conveyed shall revert back into the said James Mclemore & his heirs & assigns.
