This Indenture made this 2^d day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine
between John L. Cock of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the first part and Mills L. Gray of said
County and State of the second part and Jacob Williams of the third part whereas the said John L. Cock is fully
Indebted to the said Jacob Williams for the sum of one hundred dollars and demands the 25th December 1839
One hundred dollars to be paid 25th of December 1839 one hundred to be paid the 25 December 1840 and one hundred
and sixty seven dollars 50 cents to be paid the 25th December 1841 as by bonds bearing date on the day of
in the year 1838 more fully appears which act with the legal interest thereon accruing the said John L. Cock is
willing and desirous to secure said Indenture with further and in consideration of the promises and also for the
further Consideration of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said John L. Cock was hand paid by
the said Mills L. Gray the trustee at the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged by the said John L. Cock hath given granted bargained and sold unto the said presents
both grantee bargained and sold the said his heirs and assigns forever that tract
or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia containing
one hundred and thirteen $\frac{1}{2}$ acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows on the east by William
Nichols line S. by Barnes Road E. by Bong & Edwards S. by Mills Pope with all and singular
The appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining all the right title title and interest of this
said John L. Cock in and to the said granted parcel of land and promises. To have and to hold
the said hereby granted parcel of land with its appurtenances unto the said Mills L. Gray trustee his
heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of the said Jacob Williams his heirs and assigns
forever and the said John L. Cock for himself his heirs Executors Administrators doth hereby
promise and agree to and with the said Mills L. Gray his heirs and assigns forever in manner and
form following that is to say that the said John L. Cock his heirs &c the aforesaid parcel of land and
promises with their appurtenances unto the said Mills L. Gray trustee his heirs and assigns against
all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents upon trust that he
the said John L. Cock his heirs &c shall permit the said John L. Cock to remove
it and possible portion of the said tract of land and promises with its appurtenances and re-
nts therefrom to his own use until default be made in the payment of the said sum of four hundred
and Sixty Seven dollars 50/00 either in whole or part and upon the further trust that he or his
assigns shall and will do soon after the happening of such default of payment as he may think con-
venient or the said Jacob Williams his heirs Executors Administrators shall request sell the said tract of land
and promises with the appurtenances to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction
after having fixed the time and place of sale at his own discretion and giving twenty days notice
by advertisement to be set up at the door of the court house of said County on some Court day pre-
vious to the day of sale and out of the money arising from such sale after satisfying the charges
thereof and other expences attending the premises pay to the said Jacob Williams his heirs or
assigns the said sum of four hundred and sixty Seven dollars 50/00 with the interest which
he may lawfully have accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the said John L.
Cock his heirs and assigns But if the whole of the said sum of four hundred and sixty seven
dollars 50/00 shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Jacob Williams his heirs and
assigns on or before the 25th December 1839 when two hundred dollars will be payable so no default
of payment of the above sum of four hundred and sixty seven dollars 50/00 to be made here by the said
law to be made or else to remain in full force and in full. In witness whereof the said parties to these
