This Indenture made this 14th day of April in the year of our lord one thousand Eight Hundred Eighty Eight between

part witnesseth That the said Jacob Williams for and in consideration of the sum of fifty one dollars and
Seventeen Cents current money of Virginia to him by the said Phillip J. Blaund his husband paid the
receipt whereof the said Jacob Williams doth hereby acknowledge hath by the consent of parties
bargained and sold and conveyed by these presents of the grant bargained sell and convey to the said
Phillip J. Blaund his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County
of Southampton containing Seventeen and one fourth acres the same or less and bounded as
follows Beginning at a pine a corner standing in Amos Stephensons line thence a line of made
trees to beeches branches to a large pine corner thence up the said branches to a small pine
a new made corner thence North to a Turkey oak standing in Amos Stephensons line thence
along the said line to the beginning containing Seventeen acres by the same more or less then
and to hold the tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the
said Phillip J. Blaund his heirs or assigns to ... only use and behoof of the said Phillip J. Blaund
his heirs or assigns forever and the said Jacob Williams for himself his heirs Executors and Administrators
doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Phillip J. Blaund his heirs and assigns

witnesseth That Martha P. Ennis the wife of the aforesaid Henry & Ennis has this day by deed writing and in
some regularly and legally acknowledged by her according to law by which she the said Martha P. Ennis has agreed
to her husband Henry & Ennis and to certain portions of land lying and being in the County of Southampton
one barrel March 17/1840 but upon this condition that is to say that he the said Henry & Ennis shall and doth in consideration
of aforesaid herby grant bargain and sell unto the said John Barrett his heirs and assigns one certain piece
of land above named called To have and to hold the said piece of land aforesaid unto him the said John
Barrett his heirs and assigns forever and trust never failing that is to say that he the said John Barrett his
executors & administrators shall at all times hereafter in consideration of the death of the said Henry & Ennis
