This Indenture made and executed this day of February A.D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine between John Lawrence of the one part and Gomor Ellerpe of the other part each of 50 citizens, County of Winchester, West Virginia. Witnesseth that the said John Lawrence and Gomor do hereby mutually exchange the following parcels of lands to strengthen their line that is the line between John Lawrence and the said Gomor which was bought by Gomor Ellerpe at Commissioners sale as per report and deed from thence. The said John Lawrence doth hereby grant, alienate and convey unto the said Gomor Ellerpe his heirs and assigns forever one certain parcel of land containing by survey one acre and one rood which is bounded as follows Beginning at a white oak in the line between John Lawrence and the said Cobb tract S. 8° E. 40 ft. To a black gum a fore and after line thence the new line between the said John Lawrence and Gomor Ellerpe thence the old line N. 82° W. 12 ft. To a white oak thence N. 82° W. 36 ft. along the old line to the beginning. To have and to hold the aforesaid premises forever. for and in consideration of a certain parcel of land containing by survey one acre one rood which is bounded as follows N. 82° Beginning at a red oak at the G. Cobb road thence S. 82° E. 38 ft. along the old line between the said John Lawrence and the said Cobb tract to a sweet gum thence N. 82° W. 36 ft. To a black gum thence N. 82° W. 8 ft. to the black gum the fore and aft in the mid straight line thence S. 82° E. 24 ft. to the beginning. To have and to hold forever. The said John Lawrence and Gomor Ellerpe do hereby mutually warrant and defend the aforesaid parcels of land unto each other their heirs and assigns forever with all the reversion and reversions annuities and remainders yearly and other rents free from all claims or demands demand or demands of all and every person whatsoever. of the first part William Prince Jr. of the second part and Gomor and John Drewry of the third part these the said
John P. Hall is justly indebted to the said G. J. Drewry in the sum of two hundred and fifty eight dollars and
thirty four cents to be paid or due after the first day of next March as by one bond for two hundred and twenty five
dollars and forty eight Cents due G. J. Drewry bearing date the 25th day of January 1839 with interest thereon
from the first of January 1839 also one bond due Sam'l. Drewry for thirty dollars and eighty six cents
bearing date on the 25th day of January 1839 with interest thereon from his first day of January 1839 which
debt with interest thereon occurring the said John P. Hall is willing and desirous to pay and the said
Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration
of one dollar and a half money of Virginia to the said John P. Hall in hand paid by the said William
Prince at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
be the said John P. Hall hath given granted bargained sold alienated enfeoffed and confirmed
and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release and confirm to the said
William Prince his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit three head cattle
black mare one bay horse and one sorrel filly one gig and harness one saddle and bridle
six head cattle five does twelve several pigs one ox Cart three feather beds and furniture
Sitting Chairs one buffet two tables one of Walnut the other pine two chest one desk one
key clock one looking glass one steel one whale mill four iron bats two fire irons
one sled pedler and forty Barrels covered which covered is consumed when his dead it is reported
there as much as forty barrels if no proportion of the said John P. Hall or all that may be
