with the interest which may theron lawfully have accrued and the balance if any shall pay to the
said John Wilson his heirs exec^t adm^r or assignee: But if the whole of the said sum of one thousand dollars
with the interest which shall have accrued shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said Thomas
N. Story his exec^t adm^r and assignee on this 15th day of March 1839 when the same is payable so that
no deposit of payment of the said sum of One Thousand dollars be made then this indenture to be

have made constituted and appointed and by these presents do make constitute and appoint and in my place and
time past and despite James Davis of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia my true and lawful
attorney for me and in my name place and stead to grant bargain and sell all that I may have trust and power
of lands being and lying in the County of Southampton of state aforesaid being in the settlement called
Black Banks containing as near as I recollect 168 acres (Not certain I refer to the deed filed in the Clerk's
office at Jonesboro & seat) And all my estate right title and interest therein unto such person or persons
and for such price or prices as he shall think proper and as my present act and deed also for me and in
my name place and stead to sign seal deliver and acknowledge all such deed or acts of conveyance as
shall be necessary for the absolute granting and assigning of the premises unto the purchaser or purchasers
in fee simple also know all men by these presents that I Etheldreda Davis of Jefferson County in
the State of Arkansas have made constituted and appointed and by these presents do make constitute
and appoint and in my place and time past and despite James Davis of Southampton County and state
aforesaid planter my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name and for anyone to act demand sue for
recover and receive all such sum or sums of money debt due and owing & other demands whatsoever which is or
shall be owing payable and belonging to me by any manner or means whatsoever especially to settle
with the estate of Henry Denow aet^d of Southampton County of Virginia for sundry notes past in his
hands for collection to the amount of Seven hundred and forty six dollars and thirteen cents or thereabout
which his receipt will shew dated & signed on the 1st day of March 1833 by his own hand which receipt
will be past in the hands of my said attorney hereby ratifying allowing & holding for him and opportunity all
& whatsoever my said attorney shall lawfully do in and about the premises by virtue thereof
