This Indenture made the 29th day of December 1838 between Samuel Wallace of the first part James S. French of the second part and Theodore Treguant of the third part witnesses that whereas Samuel Wallace is justly indebted to the said Theodore Treguant by bond bearing date March 1st 1838 in the sum of one hundred and fifty five dollars 75c payable on demand; and being anxious to secure the payment of the same, and indemnify the said Treguant against all loss as well as for the receipt of one dollar to the said Samuel Wallace which is hereby acknowledged, he the said Samuel Wallace hath bargained, granted and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said J. S. French his heirs and assigns forever the tract of land on which he now lives lying on Fluggys road and bounded by the same formerly owned by Noel Huddell by the same of James Whitehouse and the same formerly owned by the Johnsons and also by Fluggys road containing acres upon tract more or less that if the said Samuel Wallace shall fail to pay the above named debt when required that then the said J. S. French shall where required by the said Theo. Treguant advertise the same at several public places for a reasonable time and then sell the same on six months credit to the highest bidder requiring cash enough to pay the expenses of sale and having set apart enough of the proceeds of said sale to pay the bond herein provided for, pay over to the said Samuel Wallace his heirs and assigns the remainder of the said French on his part covenants to execute faithfully the above deed.
