 hundred and thirty eight between Arthur A. Drury and his wife Nancy of the one part and Arington
 Vicko of the other part and all of the County of Southampton Maryland that the said Arthur A. Drury
 and wife Nancy for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred and seventy five dollars to them
 in hand paid by the said Arington Vicko at or before the signing and delivery of these presents
 do bargain and sell unto the said Arington Vicko his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract
 or parcel of land lying situate and being in the County of Southampton of and on the south of one
 acre being reserved for grave yards containing two hundred and sixteen acres more or less and bounded
 as follows North by the land of Jesse Brockner East by the land of Henry Boardman and the land belonging
 to the estate of Jesse Vicko and South by the land of John Vicko from which it is separated by Black
 Swamp and West by the land of John Vicko together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging
 the messuages and messuages yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof to the
 only use and behoof of him the said Arington Vicko his heirs and assigns forever and the said Arthur A.
 Drury and wife Nancy for themselves their heirs and assigns do warrant and forever defend the
