part and Henry H. Hill of the buying part both of the county of Southampton State of Va. This indenture
Witnesseth that the said William L. Hill for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him in his
paid by the said Henry H. Hill at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is
acknowledged have granted to bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain & sell unto the said
Henry H. Hill his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the
said County of Southampton and State of Virginia and in the parish of ~~part~~ of St. Luke containing
by estimation one hundred and ten acres to the same more or less it being my entire interest in the
land of which my Father William Hill died seized and possessed said land lying in the County of
Southampton. To him the said Henry H. Hill his heirs and assigns forever notwithstanding reserving unto the
Mason Hills own life estate which she now holds under the will of my Father William Hill deceased but
nevertheless after the death of my Mother Mason Hill. To have and to hold the said land and all the
right title interest and estate to him the said Henry H. Hill to one third part of the tract of land
