This Indenture made and entered into this 26th day of March year 1839 by and between William L Hill of the buying
part and Henry H Hill of the buying part both of the County of Southampton State of Va. This Indenture
witnesseth that the said William L Hill for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him in hand
paid by the said Henry H Hill at & before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby
acknowledged have granted bargain and sold and by these presents do grant bargain & sell unto the said
Henry H Hill his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the
said County of Southampton and State of Virginia and in the parish of parish of St. Luke's containing
by estimation One hundred and ten acres be the same more or less it being my entire interest in the
Land of which my Father William Hill dec^d seized and possessed said Land lying in the County of
Southampton. To him the said Henry H Hill his heirs and assigns forever notwithstanding saving my estate
Mason Hill's own life estate which she now holds under the will of my Father William Hill dec^d but
nevertheless after the death of my Mother Mason Hill. To have and to hold the said Land and all the
right title interest and estate to him the said Henry H Hill or one third part of the tract of Land
formerly owned by William Hill dec^d of this County which interest I derived title to under the will of
said dec^d which Ind. contains one hundred and ten acres be the same more or less the boundaries of which
is as follows to wit on the South by the W. of N. C. State Line on the west by the land of the heirs of John
Williamson dec^d on the north by the Land of John ^{Barrick} on the east by the Land of John Hill together with
all houses out houses and waters watercourses in any wise appertaining or thereunto belonging To
