This Indenture made this 15<sup>th</sup> April 1839 between Benjamin E Daugherty of the County of Southampton of the first part. Thomas N Story of the County of the second part to John Wilson of the County of the third part. whereas the said Wilson by his deed dated 15<sup>th</sup> March 1839 and acknowledged to Record on the 15<sup>th</sup> March 1839 in the Court of the County in order to secure the payment of debts then specified owing by him the said Wilson to the said Story, consigned in trust to the said Daugherty a certain tract of land lying in the County containing one hundred acres, more or less and pigs 2 lots & furniture &c &c and the said debts having been paid by the said Wilson to the said Story by the said Story has requested that he do this consigned to the trustee be now released to him the said Wilson. This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for and in consideration of the sum of \$1.00 by the said Wilson to the said Daugherty in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Daugherty with the consent of the said Story signified by his being present, have received released by the said Wilson do fully and absolutely release to the said Wilson his heirs & executors all of the estate and interest in land or equity of him the said Daugherty in a tract of Land & other property with its appurtenances To have & to hold the said tract of Land to the said Wilson his heirs & executors. This Indenture made the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October in the year ..... One thousand eight hundred and thirty four Between Zachariah Dunkford and Martha his wife of the one part and Jonathan Danforth of the other part. Whereas that the said Zachariah Dunkford and Martha his wife in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Jonathan Danforth at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the right whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them sell bargain and sell unto the said Jonathan Danforth his heirs and assigns a certain tract of Land lying by estimation Sixty eight acres to the sum more or less and bounded as follows. Beginning at a due easterly Oak standing in Jacks Branch a corner thence a line of marked trees to a large Elm tree standing in Harrison Joiners thence a long Harrison Joiners line a straight course to Taylor's gate thence to the gut to River Then down the River to a small Cypress Committee between brother Zachariah and myself thence a line of marked trees across the river to Jacks Branch to a large Elm tree a corner line to a line between brother Zachariah and myself and joining the lines of Elka from thence up the various courses of the said Jacks Branch to the beginning thereof thus with all the long low houses dove houses buildings stables yards gardens orchards lands tenements meadows pastures feedings common woods underwoods ways waters watercourses fishing privileges &c &c common commodities advantages ornaments hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or appertaining or with the same used or enjoyed or occupied nearether taken or known to part parcel or member thereof or as belonging to the same or any part thereof and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainder yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and the reversion and part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the tract of land with tenements and appurtenances and all and sing other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be long mentioned and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights ancient and future reserved unto the said Jonathan Dunkford his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only profit and benefit of him the said Jonathan Dunkford his heirs and assigns forever and the said Zachariah and myself and Martha his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Jonathan Dunkford his heirs forever
