This Indenture made this 12th day of January in the year of our lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and thirty
 nine between Thomas Drury and his wife Permelia of the one part and Henchey McHenry of the other part of
 the County of Southampton parish of New Kent State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said Thomas Drury
 and his wife Permelia for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and seventy five dollars of lawful
 money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid or secured to be paid at or before the making and delivery
 of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged both bargained and sold and by these presents
 do bargain and sell unto the said Henchey McHenry his heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of land
 parcels containing by estimate roughly seven acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows to
 beginning at a post oak at the path a corner of said Drury and Jesse Bull's land thence a line of marked trees on
 the side of said Drury and to the old pond thence a line of marked trees to a post oak thence said Drury's land to the
 side of said Drury and to a large pine near the pond a corner of said Drury and Miller Branch's
 land thence a line of marked trees by S. Branch's land a crop the river branch a corner of said land
 and of said Branch's land thence a line of marked trees on the south of the old pond to a pine a corner
 of Jesse Bull's land thence a line of marked trees down the south spring of the old pond to a small pine a
 corner of said Bull's land thence in the south spring of the said pond to a sleeping pine a corner of said Bull
 and thence to the beginning. Together with all and singular the houses out houses outhouses buildings grounds
 gardens orchards woods ways water and water courses with all and singular the appurtenances hereto
 belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same or any part or parcel thereof. To have and to hold the
 before mentioned tract of 87 acres of land with all the appurtenances thereto belonging with the remainder or
 remainder or of any rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Henchey
 McHenry his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Henchey McHenry
