of the third part whereas the said Henry Council on the 7th day of July in the year of our Lord 1839 in order
to secure the payment of the sum of One hundred sixty nine dollars 25 cts. to the said Joel Council it is by
virtue of trust of that date convey to the said Benj^a Griffin his heirs &c. One Tract of Land containing
seventy five acres more or less it being the tract of land the said Henry Council purchased of his father
Leopold Council reference to that deed being had will more fully appear upon trust for the use and
purpose in the said deed mentioned: and whereas since the executing and delivering of the said deed
of trust the said Henry Council hath fully satisfied and paid to the said Joel Council the sum of
money thereby secured which the said Joel Council doth hereby acknowledge. Now this Indenture
Witnesseth that for the consideration aforesaid as well as for the consideration of one dollar in hand paid
by the said Henry Council to the said Benjamin Griffin at or before the enrolling and delivery of these
presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Benjamin Griffin with the assent and
approbation of the said Joel Council signified by his being a party to these presents and the said
Benj^a Griffin hath bargained and sold released & confirmed unto the said Henry Council all
that tract or parcel with the right Title Interest Claim and demand both at Law and Equity which
the said Benj^a Griffin & Joel Council have or held in the said Land. To have and to hold
the said tract or parcel of Land to the said Henry Council his heirs executors administrators and
assigns forever and the said Benj^a Griffin & Joel Council for themselves their heirs executors & admin-
istrators the above mentioned Land unto the said Henry Council his heirs and assigns in as full and
ample manner as the same was warranted by the said Henry Council against the Claim or claim
of them the said Benj^a Griffin & Joel Council and all persons claiming by or under them or either
