This Indenture made and entered into this 28th day of February in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and thirty nine between Benjamin Williamson of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Thomas B. Williamson of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Williamson in consideration of the sum of seven hundred and ninety dollars of lawful money of the Commonwealth to him in hand paid by the said Thos. B. Williamson at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell to the said Thomas B. Williamson his heirs and assigns all my right title and Interest in a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton it being a part of the tract of land purchased by the said Thos. B. Williamson of David Lewis and wife and bounded as follows to wit by the lands of J. H. Harris deceased J. G. Wilson deceased and Wm. Wright deceased to have and to hold all my interest in the said tract or parcel of land the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold to the said Thomas B. Williamson his heirs and assigns forever and the said Benjamin Williamson for himself his heirs the said interest with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned to the said Thomas B. Williamson his heirs and assigns free from the claims or claims of him the said Benjamin Williamson his and all and every person whatsoever shall will and do warrant and defend forever by these presents. This Indenture made this first day of November in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and thirty eight between Jesse Lunkford of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and William Lunkford of the same County and State of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I bear to my son William Lunkford as well as for the further consideration of one dollar to me in hand paid by the said William Lunkford at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William Lunkford his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying on Black Water River in said County known by the name of Fair Island containing one hundred and five acres and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a black Gum and running N. 2. W. 2 P. to the hill or high land thence along the high lands bounding on the lands of Fowles Estate George Camps and the old Williams Neals Tract to Black water River thence along the various courses of said River to the beginning together with all and every part thereof The reversions and reversions remainders and remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and every parcel thereof To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land unto him the said William Lunkford his heirs and assigns forever and the said Jesse Lunkford for himself his heirs the said tract of land to the said William Lunkford his heirs and assigns against the claim of him the said Jesse Lunkford
