the acknowledgement thereof before two Justices of the Peace was returned and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made and entered into this the 15th day of March 1839 between Nell Gobell
Zebulon & Simmons & wife Little of the one part and Edwin Simmonns of the other part. Whereas in
a suit in Chancery depending in the County Court of Southampton between Louisa Martin and others
plaintiffs against Joseph Dorey and Emma his wife defendants at the December Term thereof
1838 the court decreed and ordered that Nicholas Nell Gobell Jeps Little Zebulon Simmons and John
James be appointed Commissioners any three of whom might act that they sell to the highest bidder
(after advertising the time and place of sale for three weeks) the several lands whereof Rebecca
Simmons died seized upon a tract of twelve months except enough money to pay the costs of the
decrees which they were to receive on the day of sale and that they take of the purchase four bonds
of equal amount of £1000 and whereas the said Nell Gobell Zebulon & Simmons & wife Little comt
having given three weeks previous notice of the time and place of sale died on the 21st day of January
1839 & left up and sold at public auction to the highest bidder the several lands aforesaid of which
Rebecca Simmons died seized containing by estimation namely three acres more or less bounded as
follows by the land of Samuel T James on the north by the land of Badly Braxton on the South
East at which sale the above named Edwin Simmonns became the purchaser being the highest
bidder at the sum of eight hundred & Fifteen dollars. Now therefore This Indenture witnesseth
that the said Nell Gobell Jeps Little & Zebulon & Simmons commoners acting under the
decree above recited for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and ninety dollars of 23 $\frac{1}{4}$
cents to them by four bonds of equal amounts secured to be paid (the residue of the purchase
money being deducted and paid in cash as the cost of the decree) at or before the sealing and
delivery of these presents which is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold
and do by these presents grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Edwin Simmonns his
heirs and assigns the above described several lands of Rebecca Simmonns decd. To have and to hold
the said lands with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises
intended to be bargained and sold unto the said Edwin Simmonns his heirs and assigns forever
And the said Nell Gobell Jeps Little & Zebulon & Simmons Commissioners acting
as aforesaid hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Edwin Simmonns his heirs and assigns
that they will warrant and defend the right and title to the land aforesaid hereby conveyed
with all its appurtenances unto him the said Edwin Simmonns his heirs and assigns against
the claim title or demand of themselves the said Commissioners or either of them or any other
persons or persons claiming by throughs or under them or either of them but against the claim
title or demand of no other person or persons whatever. In witness whereof the said commis-
sioners have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first before written
