This Indenture made this 17th day of June in the year 1839 between Thugars Lair of the County of Southampton of the first part Jacob Lenow of the second part and Francis Lenow of the third part
 So Lenow whereas the said Jacob Lenow on the 1st day of May 1838 did by indenture of trust of that date convey to the said Francis Lenow his heirs Executors of the following property to wit one side board horse 2 Cows & calves 2 beds 20 barrels board five hundred pounds of bacon one side board of Tulle one wardrobe China and Crockery were £. H. & W. 2 Thousand pounds one double gaff & harness also said Jacob Lenow interest in Francis Lenow dover right a third of the negroes allotted to him by Commissioners from the estate of Henry Lenow deceased upon trust for the use and purpose in the said indenture mentioned whereas since executing and doing of the said deed of trust the said Jacob Lenow hath fully satisfied and paid to the said Francis Lenow the several sums of money seven hundred dollars thereby secured which Francis Lenow doth hereby acknowledge now this Indenture witnesseth that for the consideration aforesaid as well as for the further Consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Jacob Lenow to the said Thugars Lair at & before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Thugars Lair with the affent and approbation of the said Francis Lenow signified by his being a party to these presents and the said Francis Lenow as aforesaid being a party to these presents and the said Francis Lenow doth hereby acknowledge and by these presents do grant bargain sell release and remise released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell release and remise unto the said Jacob Lenow all the estate right title interest claim and demands both in law and equity which the said Thugars Lair have or hold in the aforesaid property described in witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year just above written
