This Indenture made This 17th day of June in the year 1839 between Phogus Linn of the County of Lenox in the State of New York of the first part Jacob Linn of the second part and Frances Linn of the third part
whereas the said Jacob Linn on the 1st day of May 1838 did by indenture of trust of that date convey to the said Frances Linn his heirs Executors &c The following property to wit one Black horse 2 cows & calves 2 beds 20 barrels corn five hundred pounds of bacon one side board & tuble one wardrobe China and crockery ware &c &c &c 3 Thousand pounds one side board & harness also said Jacob Linn indebted to Frances Linn seven eight a third of the negroes allotted to him by Commissioners from the estate of Henry Linn deceased and doing for the use and purposes in the said indenture mentioned, whereas since executing and doing of the said deed of trust the said Jacob Linn hath fully satisfied and paid to the said Frances Linn the several sums of money seven hundred dollars thereby secured whole
Thereto said Frances Linn doth hereby acknowledge now this Indenture to be true and correct and the considerations aforesaid as well as for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Jacob Linn to the said Phogus Linn at & before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Phogus Linn with the assent and approbation of the said Frances Linn signified by her being a party to these presents and the said Frances Linn as granted bargain and release remise release and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell release remise and confirmed unto the said Jacob Linn all the estate right title interest claim and demand both in law and equity which the said Phogus Linn have or hold in the aforesaid property described in witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written
