This Indenture made the Twenty first day of December in the year of our Lord 1838 between Willoughby W. Dick of the one part and Wilson Jones of the other part Witneseth; That the said Willoughby W. Dick in consideration of fifty six dollars lawfull money of this Commonwealth to him in hand paid by the said Wilson Jones at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Have bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Wilson Jones his heirs and assigns forever the whole of interest in a certain tract of land lying in the County of Southampton containing one hundred and eleven acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows. Beginning at the foot of Proctors Bridge and running down the main run of Black Water to the mouth of Little swamp from thence up said stream to the mouth of the deep branch and up said branch to the main road and down said road to the beginning together with all the advantages emoluments hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or appertaining or accepted reported taken or known as part parcel or member thereof or as belonging to the same or any part thereof and severally by executors remainder or remainder of yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargain and sold and every part and parcel thereof his rights members and appurtenances unto the said Wilson Jones his heirs and assigns forever to and for the proper use and behoof of him the said Wilson Jones his heirs and assigns forever and the said Willoughby W. Dick for himself and his heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Wilson Jones his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of him the said Willoughby W. Dick or his heirs or all and every person or persons whatsoever shall will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents. I. M.
