Parker son of the aforesaid County of Southampton and State aforesaid of the third part: whereas the said William M. Wells is justly indebted to the said Sigs. Parker son in the sum of three hundred and thirty dollars as by bond bearing date with the indentures with lawful interest thereon until paid which the said William M. Wells is willing and desirous to secure. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar to the said William M. Wells in hand paid by the said Lawrence C. Doughtrey at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said William M. Wells both given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release and confirm to the said Lawrence C. Doughtrey his heirs executors administrators and assigns all that tract or parcel of land of which the late Joshua Gardner died seized and possessed and whereas he lived at the time of his death and now owned and possessed by the said William M. Wells lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton also one negro man named Ad. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and slave aforesaid unto the said Lawrence C. Doughtrey his heirs and assigns forever upon trust nevertheless that the said Lawrence C. Doughtrey his heirs executors administrators and assigns shall as soon as he conveniently can after the 22^d of Dec. next ensuing and having advertised the time and place of sale of the land and slave aforesaid by three several advertisements one of which shall be posted up at the door of the Courthouse of the said County on some one Court day previous to the day of sale proceed to sell to the highest bidder for
