Williams of the County aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the just sum of ten dollars Virginia money by the said James I. Williams in hand paid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Mary Drake doth hereby acknowledge thereof acquit and forever discharged the said James I. Williams his heirs and assigns forever and by these presents the said Mary Drake hath granted bargained and sold alien'd released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien release and confirm unto the said James I. Williams his heirs and assigns forever. part of that tract or parcel of land wherein the said Mary Drake now lives being the same land that John Drake purchased of Britton Ingham situated lying and being in the County of Southampton and parish of Newbury containing by estimation one acre and a half be the same more or less and bounded as follows beginning at a post or tree on side of the main road leading from black water bridge to Jerusalem thence to the fork of the Road thence down the main road to a stake near a apple tree thence a straight line to the first station together with all houses out houses edifices buildings yards gardens orchards ways water and water courses whatsoever belonging or in any wise appertaining to the said tract or parcel of land. To have and to hold the same unto the said James I. Williams to him and to his heirs and assigns forever and the said Mary Drake doth by these presents covenant and grant to and with the said James I. Williams his heirs and assigns forever that she well by these presents warrant and forever defend all right titles claims or demands of any person claiming or demanding the same or any part or parcel.
