

his heirs Executors or administrators shall permit the said Waller to remain in peaceable and quiet possession of the said land and appurtenances together with the said slaves and take the profits to his own use until default be made in the payment of the said sum of fifteen hundred and fifty dollars with interest and all cost either in whole or in part so that the said Samuel Drowry is likely to be sued or have the said debt recovered from him or his executors administrators or assigns as security for the same so soon after the happening of such default of payment at the request of the said Samuel Drowry his executors administrators or assigns shall sell the said tract of land and premises with the appurtenances together with the aforesaid slaves or such part of the hereby granted premises as the trustee or his representative hereby authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purpose of payment of the said debt interest and all cost which may accrue for ready money at public auction after having fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and given fifteen days notice thereof and advertising the same at those proper and fit places and out of the money arising from such sale after satisfying the charges thereon all other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Samuel Drowry his executors administrators or assigns the said sum of fifteen hundred and fifty dollars with the interest and cost if any which may thereto lawfully have accrued for the purpose of satisfying the said debt and the balance if any shall pay to the said Lewis Waller and his executors administrators or assigns but if the whole of the said sum of fifteen hundred and fifty dollars shall be fully paid off together with all cost so that no defect be made then this indenture to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue. This Indenture made and entered into this the 17<sup>th</sup> day of August 1839 between first  
Burke Alexander Myrick and John C. Turner of the County of Southampton of the one part and  
William Holt of the same County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Burke  
Alexander Myrick and John C. Turner as co-consignees acting under a decree of the County Court  
of Southampton pronounced on the nineteenth day of December 1836 in a cause then pending  
between Henry Holt James Holt and June Holt plaintiffs against Augustine Pope administrator  
of Jno. Holt dec'd. after giving due notice thereof did sell to the highest bidder in court  
of twelve months the lands whereof the said Jno. Holt did die seized lying and being in  
the County aforesaid containing one hundred and ninety two and one third acres more or less  
which said 192<sup>1/3</sup> acres is composed of two tracts of land adjoining each other one containing  
179 acres which the said Jno. Holt in his lifetime acquired title to by purchase from  
Holliday Roselle & others and the other containing 13<sup>1/3</sup> acres which he acquired title to by purchase  
from Jno. Burritt and is bounded as follows to wit: North by the lands of Thomas Weston  
East by the Road leading from Newsum Depot to Marbleheads West by the lands of Weston  
Pope & White Pope & South by Holliday Roselle & Lewis Norrell et al and at the side of legend  
aforesaid made the said William Holt became the purchaser of the said one hundred and
