Now therefore the said Indenture witnesseth that the said John Boykin and Caroline his wife in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of One dollar to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted given and conveyed and by these presents do grant give alien and convey to the President and directors of the Literary fund for the exclusive use of the said district one certain piece or parcel of Land containing one acre in Southampton County and bounded as follows that is to say on the North & West by the lands of John Boykin & on the South & East by the lands of Willis Caley. To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of Land and all the appurtenances belonging thereto to the said president & Directors of the Literary fund free from the claim of the said John Boykin and Caroline his wife and their heirs forever. And the said John Boykin and Caroline his wife for themselves and their heirs warrant the Title to the said land to the said President and Directors of the Literary fund against them and their heirs forever. In Witness whereof the said John Boykin and Caroline his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day & year first above written.

This Indenture made this sixth day of May in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty nine between Nathaniel A Johnson of the County of Holmes in the State of Mississippi & Amasa White of his wife Eliza formerly Eliza A Johnson of the County of Holmes in the State of Mississippi of the one part & Benjamin Edmunds of Halifax County in the State of North Carolina of the other part witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars in of the said Benjamin Edmunds to the said Nathaniel & the said Amasa & his said wife have bargained sold aliened released & confirmed as by these presents do bargain sell alien release & confirm unto the said Benjamin Edmunds & his heirs a certain tract of Land situate in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia containing two hundred acres more or less it being the same land descended to Elizabeth Cure deceased sister of the said Benjamin Edmunds from her father Edmunds dec'd & formerly of Southampton County aforesaid & which said tract or parcel of Land was conveyed by the said Elizabeth Cure & her then Husband Sugar Johnson to John A Johnson & by the said John A Johnson to the said Sugar Johnson - And the said Benjamin Edmunds hereby release to the said Benjamin Edmunds all claims whatsoever to the north & south & parts claiming of said Land heretofore secured and enjoyed by the said Elizabeth Cure or any person claiming under her. To have and to hold the said tract of Land & every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances to him the said Benjamin Edmunds his heirs and assigns forever and the said Nathaniel A Johnson & the said Amasa & his wife do hereby covenant to and with the said Benjamin Edmunds his heirs and assigns shall peaceably hold & enjoy the said Land against all persons whatsoever claiming or deriving Title to the said Land from or under the said Nathaniel A Johnson & the said Amasa White or any of them. It is understood by the parties hereto that the consequence is made by the said bargainors in fulfillment of their part of the decree made in the said which was lately pending in the Court of Equity for the County of Halifax in the State of North Carolina in which the said bargainors were plaintiffs & Eliza A Cure & her said Benjamin Edmunds being the late heir at law of the said Elizabeth Cure.
