To have and to hold the same to the said William Womble his heirs & assigns forever as we covenant to the said William Womble that we are lawfully seized of said land have a good right to convey it and that same is unincumbered - we do further covenant and bind ourselves our heirs & representatives to warrant and forever defend the title to the said land of every part thereof to the said William Womble his heirs and assigns - against the lawful claims of all persons whatsoever.
